FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Whilst first and foremost I would like to wish everyone I represent a **Very Merry Christmas** and a **Happy New Year** – I would also like to reiterate some of the support that is available to people who are at risk or experiencing financial hardship over this very testing winter.

Cornwall Council has recently secured £4.5 million pounds from the Department for Work and Pensions Household Support Fund, and the fund will primarily be used to provide one-off cash payments of: £80 to pensioners in receipt of pension credit, £80 (per child) to families with children eligible for free school meals



In the meantime, we start the ball rolling with our thank-you to a St Teath stalwart whose outstanding service to local charities was recognised in October 2001 by none other than HM Queen Elizabeth, who honoured her with an MBE at Buckingham Palace.



Yes, of course, this tribute is to PEARL who throughout her entire ninety years has been a generous, hard-working member of the St Teath community. Born in *Hillows*, on the outskirts of St Teath, the young Pearl honed her phenomenal fundraising skills by selling poppies for the British Legion at the age of 11, a task which she continued for the next 75 years. 'Selling poppies' does not begin to describe what Pearl did. She would tramp round in all weathers, rattling her collection tin at every house and going back, if necessary several times, later in the evening, if the occupants had been out at work.

After she married Ken, the couple moved into Ivy Cottage in the centre of the village, where Pearl lives to this day. When her lifelong friend, Bill Pearce started a lottery to raise funds for Plymouth Argyle Football Club in 1972, Pearl became his local agent, recruiting supporters and visiting their houses to collect weekly fees. Later when Bill launched the Cornwall Air Ambulance Lottery again it was Pearl who became its St Teath agent, now tootling round in her little car, conscientiously making regular and repeated calls to every household in St Teath and outlying areas for the next 26 years. Pearl became renowned as a legendary fundraiser. All good causes from St John's Ambulance to small local village initiatives knew that if they had Pearl's support in the form of a Raffle or a Bingo Night, they were guaranteed a sum of money surpassing all their expectations.

Pearl has shown a similar steadfast commitment to our parish church. From the time she left school and came to work for St Teath vicar, Rev Oatey she has been a loyal, dedicated member of the church congregation, helping out and supporting church activities whenever needed.

Village events have never known a gamer or more enthusiastic participant than Pearl. She can be depended on to join in wholeheartedly with any celebration and has never missed an opportunity to dress up and take part in every single St Teath Carnival for as long as any of us can remember - including this year when she waved regally from her Jubilee carriage. Now that Pearl can finally sit back and let others take over the task of organising these fundraising events, she continues to support all such efforts, donating generously and of course never failing to buy large numbers of raffle tickets.

A meeting will be held in the Community Centre on Monday 5th December at 7.30pm where it is hoped other committee members can be co-opted and the posts of Chairman and Secretary filled if the Centre is to continue running.

Please consider attending and volunteering - it will be open to all. It is a worthwhile job to work as part of a team contributing to the village community. Some jobs are mundane tasks such as checking the fire alarms every two months or reading the electric meter monthly, but someone has to do them.

All the girls showed great determination, skill and effort to gain some great results against strong opposition. The most pleasing aspect was that our girls, most of whom are fairly early on their football career, really developed as the afternoon progressed. Our highlights were a win at St Breock and draws against Wadebridge and Mount Hawke Academies, with the goals coming from Daisy and Sophia.



The sporting theme continued with a Year 3 and 4 **indoor athletics** event at SJS, where Sycamore Class competed alongside Camelford and Otterham Schools in a variety of running, throwing and jumping events. All our children showed the great commitment we expect from them, alongside excellent support and teamwork from those around them.

A METHODIST MINISTER'S VIEW

A few weeks ago, I was reading an article written by one of our leading Methodist academics who said that she had cause to think about 'Angels' more deeply. She had been asked to preach at an ecumenical service on the feast day of 'St Michael and All Angels.' Perhaps it is a subject that all of us find difficult to talk about.

At a more down-to-earth level we have, as Churches in Delabole, made knitted angels available to the whole village in recent years. Before Christmas we leave some tied to railings or trees or put them on people's door handles. Each one has some form of Christmas Message attached. The initiative follows a pilot scheme that started in the Northeast. All of the angels are hand knitted by people in the village.

There is a story of some troops seeing angels at the Battle of Mons in the first World War, so the concept of 'Angels' is more up to date than you might think.



Most of us associate angels with the Christmas Season and put an appropriate decoration on top of our Christmas trees to remember the Christmas story. Alternatively, you may put a Star on your Christmas tree instead of an angel.

We read in our Bibles of the way that angels were involved in bringing messages to Joseph (see *Matthew 1*), or Mary (*Luke 1*) and the shepherds (*Luke 2*) of the Birth of God's Son, Jesus. We read of other situations in which angels were involved in the Gospel stories. A message of the birth of John the Baptist was given to his father, Zechariah a Jewish Priest, by an angel again in *Luke 1*. Angels are mentioned in the Resurrection of Jesus stories (*Matthew 28 and John 20*). All of these are examples of God communicating with people through his messengers.

In this day and age God still communicates with people although not as spectacularly as the appearance of the angels to the Shepherds. Sometimes people experience God speaking to them through written words, sometimes through other people and at other times through meditation, prayer, or moments of inspiration. The question is are we open to God prompting us, or are we dismissive of such times?

The above is something to think about as we enter the seasons of Advent and Christmas. We hope that you experience joy, peace, and happiness through Christmas and into the New Year.






