ST TEATH SCHOOL REPORT

December proved to be an extremely busy month (as always) with festivities alongside the normal school-based events. One of the highlights was the lights switch on, which the school is always proud to support. The whole village looked amazing and we were proud to play our part with Santa's grotto. We must extend big thanks to Tom and to Sue for the use of their house; all the children clearly enjoyed their visit. I think the whole occasion is magical.

I must take this opportunity to apologise for a very important omission from my thank-you messages with regard to donating money to the school. The very generous amount donated by Reverend Angela Cooper and the Parochial Church Council of St Teath Church will make a major difference to all the children. With so much generosity towards the school from all over the community, I made a mistake and hope this apology and acknowledgment of thanks helps.

In sport, we have significant results from our touch rugby team, made up mainly of year 5 pupils. They went to Bodmin leisure centre to play other schools in a round robin format, most much bigger schools than ours. We finished the event having played 6 games, won 5 and drawn 1, battling hard as a team and creating some exquisite tries to be crowned East Cornwall Champions 2022/23 - a fantastic achievement.

Our two productions literally took centre stage in December; the infant and junior performances were again of high standard, showcasing the acting talent that is developing in St Teath. We are so proud of how the children grow in confidence each year and the roles they take on. This year the children also showed adaptability as illness meant we performed the vast majority of the shows with reduced numbers.

As well as the Christmas shows, the school also ran a secret room for children to get presents, a Christmas movie night, Christmas jumper day and Christmas Dinner. The benefit of working in school is that you get two Christmases, one with the children and one once we break up.

Away from Christmas, we had the Lego Cognitive Team coming in to teach our children how to program and Daya came in to provide opportunities to learn about culture and religion.

We also had an external monitoring visit to check on standards at St Teath; they were very complimentary about all areas of school life. In particular, they singled out the children's behaviour, the quality of learning and work in their books as specific strengths.

This term will prove to be busy as we try to get the timeline organised, start to look at a new outdoor reading area and also prepare for sporting tournaments and fixtures, with football, netball and rugby taking centre stage. 2023 has started fantastically well, in addition to the boys' rugby success our girls' football team managed a 1-0 victory against St Minver in the cup. ST TEATH PARISH COUNCIL

Do you have some spare time? Are you interested in village life?

If the answer to these questions is "Yes", the parish council is looking for someone just like you to fill two vacancies on the council. If you are interested and would like to know more, just go along to the next parish council meeting in the Community Centre on **Thursday, 2nd February**.

At the end of the meeting, which starts at 7pm, the council will co-opt new members before they become acting council members at the March meeting.

Many people use the path from the Square as a shortcut to Treroosal Road with a pair of kissing gates which have to be negotiated at each end - not easy with a pushchair or a wayward dog or two! Now you can have your say about the future of the kissing gates. Before you ask, they are not listed. Do you think they are an important feature of the village and should be retained or is it time to replace them with an alternative which gives easier access to the path? The parish council would like to hear your views.

The parish councillors would also like to remind parishioners that they are under a legal obligation to provide Cornwall Council with a local point of view on any planning applications received. Therefore if you feel strongly about any applications received, it is important to relay those views to the councillors.

A METHODIST MINISTER'S VIEW

Some years ago, there was a popular television series called the 'Forsyte Saga' which was a fictional look at family life in a particular era. It seems to me that we are now experiencing through our newspapers and news bulletins the embryonic stages of another saga – the 'Prince Harry Saga' as I prepare this article in early January.

A newspaper reporter once said to me that the best time to get press coverage for a project was when there was a shortage of news in the weeks immediately after Christmas. In this the Public Relations department of the publishers of the Duke of Sussex's book 'Spare' have certainly succeeded. Public opinion seems to be divided in reacting to the publication and all that it is revealing.

To be a member of our popular Royal Family at this time must be very difficult as the press articles and news bulletins raise different issues involving individuals in the family network. In his attempt to raise concerns about how the British press operates, Prince Harry has revealed things that, probably most of us think, should have been kept within the family circle. In the snippets which I have seen in the news bulletins Prince Harry has said that he wants reconciliation with the members of the Royal Family. One Royal Court correspondent has said that with all that has been revealed, reconciliation will be difficult. Meanwhile we will have to wait and see.

Reconciliation involves forgiveness, putting the past behind us as we move on in life. One of the writers in the Book of Psalms wrote of God – 'He forgives all my sins' (Psalm 103:3), and Jesus told the story of a Father who welcomed back his wayward son with a family celebration, we know it as the story of the Prodigal Son (see Luke 15 verse 11 onwards). In that story we read that the older Son found it difficult to participate in the celebration. In Matthew's Gospel Chapter 18 verse 21 onwards Jesus is reported as saying that we should be generous in forgiving because of God's forgiving nature. These passages challenge us as we reflect on the 'Prince Harry Saga' and look to our own family and friendship situations. Are we forgiving people?

FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

There is still time to respond to the Council's consultation on a Mayor for Cornwall and the additional powers and benefits that this might bring. Having served on the Council now for over six years, the following are my own views on the issue.

Instinctively I am not in favour of concentrating power in one individual at a local or national level. I also know that many residents already hold the view that there is too much party politics at Cornwall Council and this would inevitably take us further down that route, whilst eliminating some of the important checks and balances that our current governance system offers. I also wonder, in a year when the national governing party has had to remove one Prime Minister for losing public trust and another for economic incompetence, why we would consider a directly elected Mayor for Cornwall, who would be almost impossible to replace between local elections? Given this, I think there would need to be a very significant transfer of powers and funding to make this worth considering.

The headline figure is £390m for Cornwall. However, this is spread over 30 years and so would only actually add £12m to our annual spending of over £1bn - with none of it earmarked for our existing underfunded services. I also see that very similar deals have been offered to both Suffolk (£480m over 30 years) and Norfolk (£600m over 30 years) without the necessity of a mayor - with Secretary of State Michael Gove saying, "Ultimately it is local people who know what is best for their areas." The funding would also be subject to a number of conditions such as being able to identify brown-field sites for housing - which is almost impossible in rural areas - which I fear could lead us to deliver fewer affordable homes for young people. I am also underwhelmed by the offer of £500,000 to introduce improvements such as ticketless travel on buses given the rate that bus services have been reduced or abandoned in North Cornwall. There is no new money for reintroducing these.

There are welcome commitments to supporting the Cornish language and developing floating off-shore wind turbines – however these are both areas to which the government is quite rightly already committed, along with tightening up the legislation around second homes and holiday lets which is a national issue.

What you will not find in the online consultation is a question about who should decide and whether there will be a referendum. There is a strong sense that both the Leader and the Chief Executive of Cornwall Council would prefer the decision to be made in the Council Chamber, in order to use the current Conservative majority to maximum effect and to meet a tight timetable of electing the first Mayor in May 2024 – a full year ahead of the next local elections. My preference would be for **a referendum** - ideally in May 2024 which would then allow for a change of governance at the next local elections in May 2025 – **but only if the people of Cornwall support it**. This is the approach I will support at the Full Council in February and if you agree you will need to express this in one of the "additional information" boxes in the questionnaire.
