#### ST TEATH PARISH COUNCIL

As most of you know, the village of Delabole has now formed its own parish council and this came into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 with their councillors being chosen at an uncontested election on the 6<sup>th</sup> May .

**Councillors - St Teath Parish Council** now has a full complement of seven councillors. Four of these councillors were enrolled at the uncontested election on the 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021 and they were: Tracey Kingdon, Will Kitto, Darren French and Tanya Banks.

At the Parish Council meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> June the council co-opted the following three councillors: Nev Turner, Kerry Kitto and Bob Fox and they will attend their first meeting in July. Thank you to everyone who expressed an interest in these positions.

Cllr Dominic Fairman was successfully re-elected as the Cornwall Council member for this ward on the 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021.

**Meetings -** St Teath Parish Council continue to meet on the first Tuesday of the month at 7.00pm, although this may be subject to change, so please keep an eye on the notice board (outside the school) or our parish website. To adhere to the Covid regulations and social distancing, we are now meeting in the Church Hall which allows us a little more space.

**Neighbourhood Plan** - There are exciting times ahead for our village and one project that the Parish Council wishes to pursue is the development of a Neighbourhood Plan. This sets the focus on the future of our parish and addresses many issues including planning, development, housing needs, transport and public facilities. We need your help in planning the future for St Teath and its residents.

A PUBLIC MEETING will be held (subject to Covid 19 restrictions) to gauge residents' feelings on Tuesday, 13<sup>th</sup> July at 7.00pm in the Church Hall. A Neighbourhood Plan does not have to be completed by the Parish Council; it can be led by the council but input from residents is not only important but essential. If you are interested in joining a committee or have some field of expertise that may help, please get in touch with myself or one of the Councillors. To form a Neighbourhood Plan is a lengthy process, but by working together we can make it happen and once the plan is adopted, this will not only be a document recognised by Cornwall Council when making decisions, but a plan for the future—whether this is to expand on the assets already available or to restrict any further development. If your feeling is that a Neighbourhood Plan is not needed for St Teath, please come along and let us know.

**Parking** – Like in many villages parking is a problem given the limited spaces available, the narrow roads and the increasing number of vehicles in general. Please avoid parking your vehicle on a pavement even for a short period of time. This causes an obstruction to anyone using the footpath and pedestrians need to be protected. Also, please be aware that children may walk out between parked vehicles so limit your speed and help us all to stay safe.

#### **EDITORIAL**

Did you notice that there were some Very Important People in Cornwall last month? No, I don't mean the leaders of the G7 and the royal family. I mean the media who invaded in force.

Why does that bother me? Because so many British journalists were disparaging about our county. References to the "dinky" airport at Newquay, to this corner of England "where nothing happens", the suggestion that scones and pasties were apparently the only food that Cornwall could offer visitors and many more such comments - they made my blood boil. Patronising is an understatement.

Then there was the tabloid writer who documented her ill-fated move to Cornwall to get away from London and live in an idyllic rural community, only to flee back to the metropolis when her new life didn't turn out as she expected, blaming the "locals" for not making her welcome. Scores of readers joined in with comments slating the "Cornish" for their unwelcoming attitude and their determination to force incomers to go back to where they came from.

The Cornish? Don't brand the Cornish people in this way. Many of them were probably people, who, like me, had moved here and found a warm welcome and wonderful community spirit. Yes, of course, many people make the mistake of thinking two weeks of summer sun on a Cornish beach is ideal preparation for a life here. Bluntly, it isn't. Life isn't like that.

Next irritant. Rather than a diet of pasties and scones (delicious in the right setting), the world leaders dined on the finest of Cornish cuisine, provided by local chefs from the Watergate Bay Hotel and Hidden Hut at Portscatho and featuring the finest local produce Cornwall has to offer. They took home hampers of Cornish specialities, provided by a small St. Ives company.

In other words they experienced the best of Cornwall - even shanty songs on the beach and a visit to the Eden Project with the Queen and her family. Cornwall at its best.

I am not defending the decision to hold the G7 here or trying to justify the cost of hosting it, but it did seem that Boris Johnson has more faith in Cornwall than many of the media representatives.

Oh yes, and as an afterthought: the BBC depends on our licence fees. Was it really necessary to send so many of their journalistic elite to cover the G7? Wasn't political editor, Laura Kuenssberg, (stationed on a balcony in St, Ives) enough? Apparently not. She brought a retinue with her. Even the USA editor, Jon Sopel, flew over here to add his contribution. Perhaps his trip was worth it Enjoying a quiet drink on a pub patio he discovered President Joe Biden and his wife, Jill, had the same idea. Surprising who you meet, chilling out on an idyllic Cornish evening!

#### A Methodist Minister's View

I am writing this article a few days before the commencement of the G7 Summit meeting at St. Ives. We have become aware over the past weeks of the arrangements which have been made to enable this event to happen in a secure and safe environment. The planning, of course, has been going on for many months to police the event with some 5,000 officers, all of whom have to be briefed and accommodated.

Alongside the conference, arrangements have had to be made for the Worldwide television, radio, and newspaper journalists to be able to prepare and release their stories. The stories will produce the news headlines for a few days, but by the time you read this article things will have moved on and the newspapers recycled. The costs of all the arrangements will be quite a few million pounds – which investment we need to hope will have World Wide impact.

Many stories will emanate from the whole experience besides those which will be on our news bulletins or in the newspapers. The police, hotel staff and residents will all have a story to tell

In our Methodist Churches in the month of June we are sharing in Bible Month and this year are looking at Mark's gospel in our Bibles. Mark is the shortest of the four gospels and was the first to be in circulation for reading amongst Christian groups in the era of years 60 or 70 A.D. – about 30 years after the death of Jesus. We are used to reading short passages from the Bible, but the whole of the Gospel can be read in about 2 hours. Reading the gospel in this way gives one an overview of the story of Jesus. The challenge to all of you is to give it a try and see what impressions you form reading a story that is nearly 2,000 years old. Unlike the 'news stories it has not gone out of circulation or out of print – which is in itself amazing – and has an everlasting significance for us all.

One of the letters in our Bible was written to the Hebrews and in it the writer says, 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever', see Hebrews 13:8. The teachings of Jesus are still relevant today, and his power experienced by people. The story of Jesus is enduring and worthwhile exploring.



#### THE ST TEATH 'JOYBIRDS' - FROM 1948!

During a Church spring clean, (lockdown has been responsible for an awful lot of tidying!) various old documents came to light. One of them mentions the concert party which Sylvia Mewton had joined in about 1940. It had been formed by Kitty Parsons and the Revd Bray and performed at various events around North Cornwall. At the end of 2019, the former St Teath WI voted to form a new women's group, and after much hilarity and a democratic vote, Sylvia's suggestion that we become known as "The St Teath Joybirds", after the original concert party, was duly adopted! This is an extract, from a document of 1948, which I sent to Sylvia, in which plans are being made for the Fete:-

"It was also decided to have a Lady's Ankle Judging Competition. Entry fee 6d Prize being a pair of Lady's Silk Stockings. Flora Dance in the evening to be followed by a concert given by the **St Teath Joybirds**. Admission to concert 1/6d."

I was desperate to find out who had the finest ankles and won the 'Lady's Silk Stockings', so asked if Sylvia could remember, and this is part of her reply:-

"Thanks for the letter, very interesting ........ I knew all present also Revd Oatey who married us. But I can tell you who won the Silk Stockings: Miss O. James, Mrs Parson's sister. We were all envious as you could not get stockings, only from the Yanks at Hengar Manor where they were stationed. O dear, sights not heard of!"

Thank you, Sylvia! I am now left wondering who was the 'lucky?' judge of 'Lady's ankles'!




