#### FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

By the time this parish magazine is delivered I hope that the new 20 mph zones will have been rolled out across all of the parishes in the Camelford Network Area, including this and all the other villages in my division.

Previously it has been extremely hard to get 20 mph zones implemented due to the high cost and ongoing maintenance obligations of installing speed humps and/or speed cushions. However, following a successful campaign by the 20-is-Plenty group, Cornwall Council have decided to trial a sign-only approach in line with the guidelines that 20-is-Plenty have developed. By and large, all the new 20 zones will encompass most of the current 30 mph zones with some minor exceptions where the drop in speed requires a staged approach or where the current 30 limits are in an area that is not obviously residential.

There is a reasonable expectation that by making this the norm across a wide geographical area and with a strong public awareness campaign and ongoing education and support for Community Speed Watch schemes, it should be enough to lower the overall speed of traffic in our villages, making them more pedestrian and cycle friendly and generally more pleasant to live in.

If you are interested in joining or setting up a Community Speed Watch, then please get in touch with me. These are a really effective way of targeting speeding motorists, and it is sad to note that most of the letters issued as a result of being "zapped" go to local drivers.

The schemes will also be helped by new legislation ensuring the mandatory fitting of speed warning indicators in all new cars from July. Whilst I have heard that some members of the current Government are against the idea, I can only hope that Parliament overall continues to see sense on this matter, as the evidence around road and pedestrian safety with reduced speeds is very strong and this is certainly a change I support.

The other plus side of this approach to 20 zones is that it avoids some of the noise and air quality issues that can arise from having a series of speed humps in a residential area. The constant speeding up and slowing down of vehicles is well known to increase emissions and pollution and can be a real nuisance to nearby homes.

Other measures that will help to make the scheme a success are being considered in some villages such as flashing speed indicators that can be move between sites - but by far the most effective measure to ensure the success of these schemes is if every one of us respects the new limits from day one as we drive around in our communities and so begin to make a cultural change in our area to the benefit of all.

**Meeting day** - Please remember the change of day, as St Teath Parish Council meetings are now held on the **first Thursday of the month**. The meetings continue to start at 7.00pm Meetings are held in the Community Centre.

#### ST TEATH COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (CSW)

Between 9.30 – 10.30 am on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April, out of 64 vehicles, 23 (36%) were speeding:

1 x 52(!!), 1 x 43, 1 x 42, 1 x 41, 2 x 40, 1 x 39, 3 x 38, 5 x 37, 1 x 36, 7 x 35mph.

Between 9.30 – 10.30am on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> April, out of 60 vehicles 20 (33%) were speeding:

1 x 47, 3 x 44, 1 x 41, 1 x 39, 5 x 38, 2 x 37, 7 x 35mph.

Between 2 – 3pm on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> April, out of 58 vehicles, 18 (21%) were speeding:

1 x 42, 1 x 41, 3 x 40, 1 x 39, 1 x 38, 3 x 37, 5 x 36, 3 x 35mph.

Between 10-11am on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May, out of 63 vehicles, 22(33%) were speeding:

1 x 48, 1 x 46, 1 x 44, 1 x 42, 2 x 41, 1 x 40, 3 x 39, 1 x 38, 4 x 37, 3 x 36, 4 x 35mph

**52mph** is the second highest speed we have ever recorded, (the fastest being 62 mph some time ago). We believe that you will agree with us that such speeds are horrendous, but all speeds over the current 30mph speed limit are dangerous. We would urge you, for the sake of all, to please watch your speed before some-one else is killed or very seriously injured.

#### PAUSE FOR THOUGHT

It has been another turbulent 12 months for our Queen. I suspect that few of us will forget the sight of her sitting masked, isolated and oh so alone at the funeral service for HRH Prince Philip at the height of the Covid pandemic. She has coped with this most personal of bereavements, family divisions and press intrusion and now at 96 she is clearly increasingly frail; after 70 years of unstinting service to the nation and the Commonwealth she is having to leave attendance at key events to other members of the Royal Family.

What has been the source of her remarkable strength over 70 years? In her foreword for a book celebrating her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday, her Majesty wrote,

'In my first Christmas Broadcast in 1952, I asked the people of the Commonwealth and Empire to pray for me as I prepared to dedicate myself to their service at my Coronation. I have been — and remain- very grateful to you for your prayers and to God for His steadfast love. I have indeed seen his faithfulness.'

And in her Christmas Broadcast in 2002 she summed-up the source of her strength like this...

'I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel.'

As we gather to celebrate this Platinum Jubilee in many different ways, let's also pause to give thanks for her Majesty and reflect on how we might draw strength to face tough times.

Perhaps you would like to join us in the Church for a short service of thanksgiving for 70 Royal Years as we launch our Flower festival on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June at 9.30am.

Enjoy the celebrations. God bless her Majesty!

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor,

I know that many readers of Timepiece, like me, enjoy exploring our beautiful local area on our network of paths. During the pandemic access to the countryside for our daily exercise was a salvation to many of us

In lockdown I looked at the local map and Cornwall Council's definitive rights of way map to try and vary my route. As I explored I became more and more concerned about the state of our paths. Within our immediate parish, there are over a third of paths that are not signed from the road – this is a legal responsibility of Cornwall Council. It is important as if you do not know the path is there, how can you follow it? There are 8 stiles that are either completely broken or are in such a dangerous condition that they are almost impassable. Some paths are blocked or completely overgrown. Waymarking is very poor and some paths are not waymarked at all. In places electric fences and barbed wire obstruct paths. A gate on one path is broken making it impossible to open. One path has had a farm building erected (many years ago) on the line of the path and no diversion created.

I reported these issues to Cornwall Council, both via our local councillor and the Countryside Access Team, and was disappointed with their response - that they had no money to deal with the issues. I also reported them to the Parish Council over a year ago but despite repeated promises, nothing has happened.






