
ST TEATH SCHOOL REPORT

Despite two weeks of the last month being a well-deserved break for students and staff, there has still been a lot going on at the school. The most exciting news is that we have qualified for the county final of the Broad Shield, so have a chance to show that we are the best football side in Cornwall for schools our size. This takes place in May. We took two sides to the mixed North Cornwall tournament, featuring 15 sides and again showed our class – St Teath Neons won the main tournament, called The Champions League, undefeated without conceding a goal in 7 games. Our St Teath Greens then made it a double by winning the 2nd tournament, the Europa League. Another stupendous achievement for our talented, hardworking footballers.



- . Away from sport, Easter celebrations were another highlight. The standard of eggs decorated by the children was amazing, (see photos opposite) to the point where I dreaded being one of the judges because they were all so innovative and impressive. Following this, we had the egg-rolling competition. The winning eggs nearly made the main road from the top of the playground, which was remarkable.

FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Firstly, I would like to thank all the people who responded to the Council consultation on the Devolution Deal and the prospect of replacing the Council leadership with a directly elected Mayor.

Many residents contacted me after my February update and were prompted to let the council know their views. With 69% of respondents against the idea it was refreshing to see this taken notice of – especially as the consultation questions were weighted so heavily towards making the change. By the time you read this we will have had our April Full Council meeting at which I will be supporting a cross party motion to this effect:

We, the undersigned, are therefore disappointed at the content of the "devolution deal," which principally represents accommodations between central government and Cornwall's unitary authority, rather than a meaningful devolution settlement as achieved in Wales and Scotland.

Cornwall Council resolves to inform the UK Government that we wish to commence negotiations for a more meaningful devolution settlement similar to those enjoyed in the other Celtic parts of the UK.

Cornwall Council also resolves to request a meeting between the Secretary of State and a cross-party delegation from Cornwall Council as a matter of urgency.

Secondly, the Council has launched the third round of the Community Infrastructure Levy funding, enabling community groups, town and parish councils and not for profit organisations to bid for between £20,000 and £100,000.

With a high level of interest in last year's fund, this CIL fund round will once again support local infrastructure projects which focus on supporting children and young people and help to either alleviate the impact of development on an area or help development to come forward.

Groups interested in applying for the funding should submit an expression of interest with a brief summary of the aims and objectives of their project. This will ensure that applicants only spend time and effort in working up a full application for eligible and appropriate projects.

The initial Expression of Interest stage will run until **Thursday 22 June**, after which eligible projects will be invited to submit a full application. Applications must then be submitted by the end of October, with the successful projects expected to be announced in early 2024.

ST TEATH PARISH COUNCIL LAUNCHES COMMUNITY SPARKS FUND


St Teath Parish Council is launching a new Community Sparks Fund in its 2023-24 Budget to provide funding support for local groups and organisations within the village to grow new ideas.

All community groups and organisations are therefore invited to come along to the Annual Parish Meeting on **Tuesday**, **2 May 2023** to share what they've been up to this year and then explain what their plans are for the next 12 months ready to submit a funding request later this year.

The new Community Sparks Fund will be administered by St Teath Parish Council and there will be a chance to submit ideas for funding in September every year. The Parish Council will then use the new Fund to award small grants to enable groups and individuals to kick start and grow their new projects or initiatives. The Council will be particularly interested in helping to fund ideas that have a positive impact on the village and allow people to feel a greater sense of belonging and involvement in the community.

The deadline for submitting ideas for the 2023- 2024 Sparks Fund will be 30 September 2023.



A METHODIST MINISTER'S VIEW

In late March I glanced over a newspaper article that referred to the number of Bank Holiday weekends which we would be experiencing in April and May. The writer was arguing that such holiday weekends would be better spread out across the year and made no mention of the derivation of these opportunities.

Three Bank Holiday weekends occur this year in May, two of which will have significant celebratory opportunity associated with them. May 1st was added to our Bank Holidays some years ago as a chance for workers to celebrate. In addition this year we have 8th May as a Bank Holiday in celebration of the King Charles Coronation which is on Saturday 6th May, with an Open-Air Concert the following day and the Monday intended for local festivities to mark the occasion.

Only if you are over 70 years of age will you remember anything of the Coronation of our late Queen in 1953. I recall attending a service at our local church on the morning of the Coronation Day, a Sports Event in the afternoon and a children's tea at our local school to conclude it. The images of the spectacular event were shared nationwide through local cinemas in the weeks that followed by schools and families. The Regal Cinema in Delabole had a very busy period then.

As you share in the Coronation events this year, I wonder what you will think is the most important part. For all of us, hopefully, we will see the Coronation Service in Westminster Abbey as the most important aspect when the King makes promises to serve, and as a nation we pray for him as we share through the medium of our televisions. All the other aspects of the weekend flow from the God-focused dimension at Westminster Abbey. It challenges our thinking.

The final weekend in May is now known as the Late Spring Bank Holiday, but this year it coincides with the Pentecost Weekend or Whitsuntide as we sometimes call it. Pentecost or Whitsuntide was the original reason for the Bank Holiday and it changed dates according to the church calendar. However, this year we can celebrate God's gift to us of his Holy Spirit, through which all of us can be enabled and inspired as were the first Christian followers nearly 2,000 years ago. The Book of the Acts of the Apostles, or Acts as we know it, tells the story of the power of the Holy Spirit working through ordinary people who opened their lives to God's influence and power. A power which is still available to us, read the book of Acts to find out more.

ST TEATH COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH (CSW)

On 2^{nd} March, out of 50 passing vehicles, 8 were being driven at the following speeds within the 30 mph speed restriction zone: **1 x 43mph: 2 x 38mph: 3 x 37mph: 2 x 35mph.**

On 23rd March, 7 out of 50 passing vehicles were being driven at the following speeds:

1 x 37mph: 6 x 35mph.

On 30th March, 7 out of 57 passing vehicles were being driven at the following speeds:

1 x 44 mph: 1 x 42mph: 1 x 39mph: 3 x 37mph: 1 x 36mph:

On 6th April, between 10.30am and 11.30am, 12 out of 60 passing vehicles were being driven at :

1 x 43mph, 1 x 42mph, 1 x 39mph, 2 x 38mph, 1 x 36mph, 6 x 35mph:

On 13th April, between 2.30pm and 3.30pm, out of 54 passing vehicles, 16 were being driven at the following speeds: 1 x 47mph, 1 x 42mph; 1 x 41mph; 1 x 40mph; 2 x 39mph; 1 x 38mph; 1 x 37mph; 3 x 36mph; 5 x 35mph.

The above vehicle driven at 47mph was a young person on a motor cycle! We hope that when he receives a letter from the police regarding his speed he will reflect on it, follow the advice given in it and drive more safely in future. He should also bear in mind that records show that fatalities and serious injuries are 30 times more likely for a motor cyclist than a car driver.

It should also be noted that a number of these speeds were recorded at the time the children were leaving school.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THERE IS NOW A 20mph SPEED RESTRICTION THOUGHOUT THE VILLAGE.




