#### **PARISH COUNCIL REPORT**

**Your Parish Councillors are**:- Tracey Kingdon (Chairman), Will Kitto (Vice Chairman), Tanya Banks, Darren French, Kerri Kitto, Bob Fox and Nev Turner.

Cllr Dominic Fairman is the Cornwall Council ward member.

**Meetings** are held on the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of the month at 7.00pm in the Church Hall. This has more space for social distancing but we may well return to the Community Centre in 2022.

**Neighbourhood Plan** – The Neighbourhood Plan is being led by Cllrs Bob Fox and Kerri Kitto and thanks to everyone who attended the first public meeting in September. Bob will be giving regular updates on this project. Please get in touch if you are interested in joining the group, you do not have to be a councillor.

**Village Green-** The council are looking at options for a new item of play equipment for the Green. The swing seats and chains have been removed for safety reasons and will be repaired. Hopefully all work will be completed very soon.

**Bus Shelter –** Costs are being obtained to repair the damage on the corner of the bus shelter roof and we are working with Cormac to get a bollard installed to keep vehicles away and protect the structure from any further damage. A new bench will also be installed inside the bus shelter.

**Footpaths and Public Rights of Way** – There are several footpaths in the parish and many are regularly used. If you have any concerns about public rights of way, please let us know.

**Bench at Newhall Green** – A new replacement bench has been ordered for Newhall Green and should be delivered within the next few weeks.

**Next Meeting.** The date of the next meeting is Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2021 at 7.00pm. Members of the public are always welcome to attend and can address councillors in the public session at the start of the meeting, or just sit and listen to the proceedings.

#### A METHODIST MINISTER'S VIEW

Many of you, like me, will have watched the television coverage of the Chelsea Flower Show at the end of September. The timing of the event was a 'first' for the Royal Horticultural Society in holding an autumn show because of the Covid pandemic – in this sense it was 'unique'.

The Show for me was also 'unique' in that The Bible Society sponsored one of the Show Gardens and received a Gold Medal for it. The garden was based on Psalm 23, which is probably of the best known of all the Psalms and begins with the words *The Lord is my Shepherd*. Probably the most popular version of the Psalm is the hymn version which for over 70 years we have sung to the tune *Crimond*, after the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh used it at their wedding in 1947. The words of the hymn version date from 1650.

The Bible Society, formerly known as the British and Foreign Bible Society has a history going back into the 1800's. The aims of the Society have always been to make the Bible and its teaching accessible and available. Many people will relate to the Society's work in translating the scriptures into other languages – a work which is on-going even at this time.

The purpose of sponsoring the Show Garden was to remind people, both the visitors to the show and worldwide television audiences, of the relevance of the Bible – God's inspired word for everyday living. On this occasion they used words which are at least 3,000 years old attributed to David, a Bethlehem shepherd who became a King in the Old Testament days.

The Garden Designer, Sarah Eberle, was inspired by the words for her Show Garden. She is an experienced garden designer who spent some time in her childhood living on Dartmoor, which was the source of inspiration for her Garden, having reflected on the words of the Psalm. The garden was designed to depict *Life as a Journey* which we all undertake. The planting in the garden was made to represent God's generous provision for us – the *green pastures* of the Psalm. The path in the garden led people beside *still waters* which emanated from a waterfall feature. The rocks around the waterfall area served as a reminder of both the everlasting, enduring power of God and the 'difficult areas of life' which we all encounter in its *dark valleys* and pass through. Sarah Eberle is quoted as saying that she hoped the garden would offer visitors solace, tranquillity and hope as they reflected on the words of the Psalm.

A book about the Show Garden project was published in October entitled Sarah Eberle's Psalm 23 Garden, with pictures of the garden. It contains some gardening advice from Sarah, as well as meditations on the Psalm and stories of people who have been impacted by it. It contains 52 pages and is priced at £6.50 – an affordable gift idea for the coming season perhaps.

It is quite marvellous that words written so long ago still inspire and have an impact upon people today, providing food for thought for all of us. Every blessing in your pondering and reflecting on the 'Pathway of Life'.



# The General Vestry Held October 6th 1834

Another snippet from items discovered in the great 'Lockdown Tidy in church!' In 1834, the St Teath Vestry, amongst its many other duties, was responsible for friends and neighbours in need. The phrase "thrown on the Parish" described those who were no longer able to provide for themselves or their families, either through sickness or extremely poor wages and income. It was the local Parish Vestry, composed of representatives from both church and village, who dispensed 'charity' from funds raised through a local tax. The following extract comes from the St Teath Vestry records and gives an insight not only into the hardships of life in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, but the support which was provided by their local community.
