FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

In July I held a well-attended Town Hall meeting in Wadebridge which focused on water quality issues in the River Camel and River Allen. Various agencies such as the Environment Agency, South West Water, the NFU, Natural England, the Westcountry Rivers Trust, and Cornwall Council gave presentations and then took questions from the public and members of our Town and Parish Councils.

Whilst the moratorium on new planning applications in the catchment continues due to the high phosphate levels in the water, many of the public concerns that night were around nitrates and the associated discharges of raw sewage from the many South West Water waste water treatment plants which are there to service our villages.

Data from the Rivers Trust shows the following local information for the discharge of untreated sewage from sewer storm overflows in 2021:

Delabole 1: Discharged 247 times – for a total of 1719 hours

Delabole 2: Discharged 134 times – for a total of 2142 hours

St Teath: Discharged 112 times – for a total of 102 hours

Camelford: Discharged 34 times – for a total of 359 hours

St Kew: Discharged 8 times – for a total of 19 hours

This is a very poor record and one that I know concerns many residents. One of key issues highlighted in the meeting was the lack of available data on water quality and the reduction of testing by public bodies. This is something we can address at a local level.

The Westcountry Rivers Trust is running a citizen science program to fill in gaps in the data and I would like to recruit some volunteers from each of my parishes to help spot pollution incidents and in turn to help keep up the pressure on South West Water and the various agencies to make the changes we all want to see.

If this is something that would interest you, please get in touch. Kit and training will be supplied, and the commitment will only be around a couple of hours a month to test a stretch of river in your local area.

ST TEATH PARISH COUNCIL

COUNCILLORS: Kerri Kitto, Tracey Kingdon, Will Kitto, Tanya Banks, Neville Turner, Geoff.Gale. The council has another casual vacancy left by the resignation of Cllr Bob Fox. On behalf of the council, I would like to thank Bob for his work and in particular for leading the project to produce a Neighbour Development Plan. This will continue until the plan is completed and adopted.

CHANGE OF MEETING DAY - Meetings are now on the **first Thursday** of the month. Meetings are held in the Community Centre starting 7.00pm.

PLANNING – The parish council are consulted on planning applications within the parish. Although the parish council cannot make decisions on whether or not an application is approved or refused (this is ultimately the decision of the Cornwall Council planning officer based on the regulations in the National Planning Policy Framework) we can make comments that may assist or influence the officer's decision.

NEW FOOTPATH along North Road – Councillors are aware that problems have arisen following the creation of the new pavement along North Road that was constructed in conjunction with the new housing development. Cornwall Council planning enforcement have been asked to check the constructed design against the planning application. Cormac have also been made aware of the problems. As yet the parish council have not received any replies to their enquiries but will keep you updated in future reports.

BUS SHELTER- A new bus shelter has been built along North Road A grant from Cornwall Council has contributed £2,000.00. towards the costs

BUS SERVICES – Bus services have now improved with services passing through the village up to four times a day. It is not known if this is a permanent or temporary reschedule of services but please support the bus services and hopefully they will continue to accommodate parishioners' needs.

DOG BINS – At the September meeting Councillors reviewed the emptying of the dog bins owned by the parish council.. These bins are situated at Newhall Green and adjacent to the old Chapel at Trevilley Lane. All other dog bins are owned by Cornwall Council. Owing to costs the parish council have decided to have the emptying of their bins reduced from twice a week to once a week. This will be monitored. Please use dog faeces' bags and not large carrier bags that fill the bin with plastic.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY – Plans are being made to enhance the Remembrance Service and to honour those from within and outside the parish who never came back from war. Please join us and remember those who dedicated their lives to protecting others.

NEXT MEETING. The date of the next meeting is **Thursday, 3rd Nov 2022** at 7.00pm. Members of the public are always welcome to attend and talk to councillors in the public session at the start of the meeting, or just sit and listen to the proceedings.

ST TEATH COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (CSW)

On 18.8.22, out of 61 vehicles monitored, 15 (25%) were speeding as follows:

2 x 42mph, 1 x 41mph, 3 x 37mph, 5 x 36mph, 4 x 35mph.

On the 16.9.22, out of 62 vehicles 10 (16%) vehicles were speeding as follows:

2 x 39mph, 1 x 38mph, 3 x 37mph, 2 x 36mph 2 x 35mph.

On 22.9.22, out of 62 vehicles monitored 12 (21%) vehicles were speeding as follow:

1 x 43mph, 1 x 41mph, 1 x 40mph, 1 x 39mph, 2 x38mph, 4 x 37mph, 1 x 36 mph 1 x 35mph.

On 13.10.22, out of 91 vehicles monitored,13 (14%) vehicles were speeding as follows:

1 x 39mph, 2 x 38mph, 5 x 36mph 5 x 35mph.

The last set of figures (13.10.22) is a vast improvement on some of the results which have been recorded. Well done the 78 drivers who drove within the speed limit !

A METHODIST MINISTER'S VIEW

I was recently in a three-way conversation which evolved into us talking about the World as we are experiencing it at the present time. At this point one person left us saying that he finds the current situation too depressing to talk about. A number of other people have expressed the same sentiment to me in other situations.

I fully understand such feelings amongst people as we daily learn of the continuing conflict in the Ukraine and suffer some of the consequences of it in the rise in the price of our fuel be it electricity, oil, gas, coal or logs. Added to this are the increasing prices in our shops as a direct consequence of the energy prices and shortages of some products. Most of us are worried about the increased costs and whether being able to meet them. These costs, but other factors as well, have led to the on-going strikes by our railway staff and postal workers. What is more is that other employee groups are considering strike action causing us to wonder where it is all going to end. This is happening around us as we approach our annual Remembrance Weekend when there will be acts of Remembrance on Friday 11th November, and Sunday 13th November in various locations. It is important for us all to use these opportunities to 'remember' the sacrifice of so many in various conflicts which enables us to live with the relative freedom which we have today.

What is of concern to me in all of the conflicts, be it between countries, or employing bodies and employees, is that we hear very little about peace-making initiatives. As I was thinking in these terms, I recalled one of Jesus' statements in what we know as the 'Beatitudes' which can be found in Chapter 5 of Matthew's gospel, where it reads '*Blessed are the peace makers: for they shall be called the children of God*'. The same phrase in the Good News version of the Bible is '*Happy are those who work for peace. God will call them his children*'; The same verse in 'The Message' translation reads '*You're blessed when you can show people how to co-operate instead of compete or fight. That's when you discover who you really are, and your place in God's family.*'

This is how God wants us to be – the 'Be Attitude.' As we ponder the current conflicts and Remembrance Weekend there is food for thought and action in Jesus' statement. Please pray for peace in all the conflicts and be a peace maker.

PAUSE FOR THOUGHT

November begins the busiest period of the year for the Church. **Halloween**, a contraction of All Hallows Eve, on October 31, initiates the season of Allhallowtide, which lasts three days. Halloween itself has always had a pagan flavour but is followed by All Saint's Day on 1st November and concludes with **All Souls' Day** on **Wednesday 2nd** which will be celebrated at St Tetha's at 4pm on that day. This is a quiet and solemn service when we remember deceased friends and relatives, whether they died recently or some time ago. Even if you do not generally come to church, this may be a service you might wish to attend, particularly if you have lost someone close recently.

Sunday 13th is another big day in the Church's year: **Remembrance Sunday**. There will be an act of remembrance at the memorial in St Teath at 10:45 followed by a service in church at 11:10. We will say again those poignant words from Laurence Binyon's poem "*For the Fallen*" as we remember this year not only those fallen in past conflicts but also those who have fallen this year in the battle for Ukraine.

*They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old;
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and in the morning
We will remember them.*

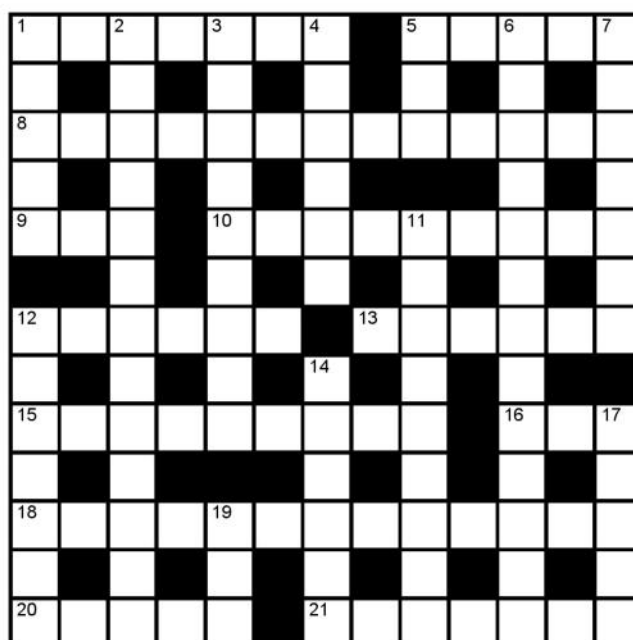
A less well known poem of Binyon's, "*The Burning of the Leaves*", seems to capture this autumnal season working its way towards winter before rebirth in the spring and which, as we hope and pray for an end to the devastation in Ukraine, also speaks of the relentless march of time, in a voice which manages to be both melancholy, yet also hopeful:

*Now is the time for the burning of the leaves.
They go to the fire; the nostril pricks with smoke
Wandering slowly into a weeping mist.
Brittle and blotched, ragged and rotten sheaves!
A flame seizes the smouldering ruin and bites
On stubborn stalks that crackle as they resist.

.They will come again, the leaf and the flower, to arise
From squalor of rottenness into the old splendour,
And magical scents to a wondering memory bring;
The same glory, to shine upon different eyes.
Earth cares for her own ruins, naught for ours.
Nothing is certain, only the certain spring.*

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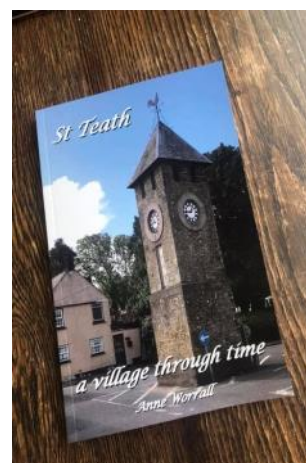
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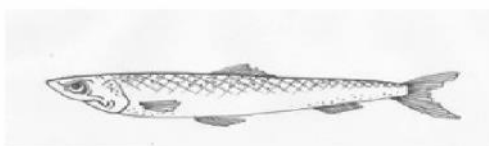

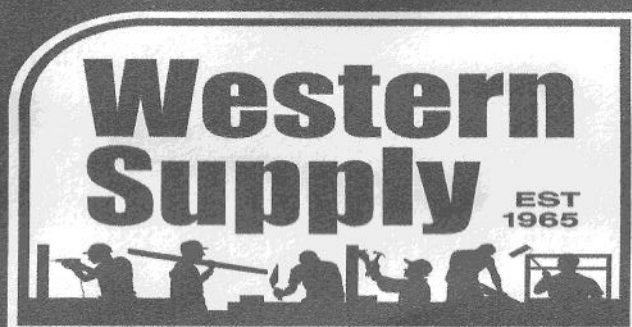
