Fires have been raging in Australia since September. Twenty nine people have died, many more are missing. Hundreds of people have lost their homes and one expert estimates that one billion animals have died. One billion.... and this is still only the start of the hot summer. We have all seen photographs of the devastation but, on the opposite side of the world, how can we help?

This is where social media comes into its own with *Go fund me* and *Facebook* pages organising fund raising for voluntary firefighters, for animal rescue, for food for the displaced, for tree planting to replace the habitat which has been devastated. Perhaps you are not on *Facebook* (like me) or you don't have access to the online appeals, but now you can help too, thanks to Not The W.I.. otherwise known as the *Joybirds*.

In case you haven't heard, our WI branch members decided at the end of last year to go it alone, no longer paying out large amounts to a national federation with little benefit to themselves. They are not on their own. Many others have had similar complaints. Just read the stories in the national newspapers about branches being forced to close after over 100 years and members rebelling against national demands.

The former WI have now reformed as the *St Teath Joybirds* (see the report in Timepiece). A new name and a new constitution but with the chance to spend their money as they want. Good for you, girls!

However, they are as determined as ever to help the community and raise money for those who desperately need help.

The first fund raiser is a **Bacon Butty and Hot Dog morning** in the community centre on Saturday, February 15<sup>th</sup>. All the proceeds will go to the Australian fire fighters (many of them volunteers who are risking their lives to do this work) and the country's animal charities.

Can there be a more worthy cause at the start of 2020?

#### FROM OUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

There has been much uncertainty in both St Teath and Delabole during 2019 around potential new housing developments which have had public consultations but have yet to seek formal planning permissions.

One of the reasons that developers are attracted to the parish is that the Cornwall Council Homechoice housing register of local housing need is only kept for the whole parish and not the individual villages. This joint figure can then be used to justify new affordable led housing developments that are perhaps larger than either village requires.

This issue will of course be resolved in May 2021 when Delabole will become a parish in its own right and at that point the Homechoice list will be required to reflect each village separately.

Meanwhile, I am pleased to report that the Parish Council have agreed to commission a detailed Housing Needs Survey from Cornwall Council which will provide a much greater level of detail for each village and will help ensure that we only build the right number of houses in the right places for genuine local need.

All residents in the parish will receive a letter explaining the process and details of how to access the online survey, and I would urge everyone to complete this for themselves or any family members who require affordable housing, and also to specify in which village the need is for.

This will be vital information to inform potential developments and ensure that we do not build new affordable houses where there is no local need. It will also be a strong first step towards developing Neighbourhood Plans for both villages so that local people can have the maximum influence on the siting of any new developments in the future.

Paper copies are available for people unable to access the internet and please let me know by phone or text if you are having difficulties. The consultation will run until the 8th March which should give all residents plenty of time to respond.

The lack of suitable and affordable housing for young families is one of the key issues that comes to me on a regular basis and I hope you will be able to support the Parish Council in getting this crucial and detailed information for the parish so that we can all make better informed decisions about housing for the future generations.

**Parish Council Vacancy -** The Parish Council currently have a vacancy for the Delabole Ward after the resignation of Cllr Garry Ellis. We thank Garry for his work with the Council and send him and his family best wishes for the future. The vacancy has been advertised by Cornwall Council and by the time this is published we will know if an election has been called or whether or not the Council have been instructed to fill the vacancy by co-option.

If the Parish Council are to carry out the co-option process, application letters or emails should be sent direct to me. The co-option process will take place at the March meeting. For further information please look at the notice board and website or contact me directly.

**Housing Need Survey -** The Parish Council have commissioned Cornwall Council to carry out a Housing Need Survey for the parish. The questions are specific to help us establish whether or not there is a need for future developments and, if so, how they should be managed and what they should provide in terms of affordability for rent or purchase. Cornwall Council will be writing to all households within the next few weeks, so please take time to complete this questionnaire. The results of the survey can be used to feed information into a Neighbourhood Plan and help to establish what is required for the future and justify the objections to any plans that are not suitable.

**St Teath Village Green & Play Area** - The Council have recognised that the play equipment on The Green should now be replaced. Our Open Spaces Committee will look at various options so any suggestions would be welcomed. A new rubbish bin is being purchased for the new play area. Please use the bins and help to keep the parks tidy.

**Parking and Speeding -** We receive many complaints about parking in our villages. We understand that traffic has increased and many households now have more than one vehicle. Whether you live in the villages or visit family, friends, the churches or the schools, please be aware where you park your car. Do not obstruct junctions, visibility for other road users or block resident's

driveways; even if you are just parked for a few minutes.

The Parish Council pay for a traffic warden to visit Delabole each week, on different days and times and they have issued some fines. The Parish Council do not wish to target drivers but to try and keep our public safe. Please remember when driving that a child could always walk out between parked cars so your visibility will be limited.

Another matter of concern is the speed of vehicles, and often it is residents who can be the worst offenders, becoming complacent with the local road network. The large agricultural tractors have in the past caused some problems. The owners were contacted, so please let me know if any further incidents happen.

**Future Meetings -** Tues, 4<sup>th</sup> Feb at St Teath; Tues, 3<sup>rd</sup> March at Delabole. Meetings start at 7pm and members of the public are welcome to attend.

By the time of my next report I should have information on the Governance Review, so I will keep you posted.

#### TREVEIGHAN METHODIST CHURCH

At the United Parish Carol service in Michaelstow, and also on Christmas Eve, it was decided to donate the collection to Cornwall Blood Bikes.

This is a charity which ferries blood and other medical necessities all over the country by a small group of dedicated volunteers. The charity receives no funding other than that which is given by members of the public. We were able to send a donation of £110.

#### So it is goodbye W.I. and hello 'Joybirds'!

Way back on 27th November 2019, the women who belonged to St Teath W.I. called a Special Meeting where they decided they had had enough of the financial controls, rules and regulations, politics, yearly resolutions and endless stream of paperwork that being members of the W.I. generates nowadays. Their decisions were certainly made easier when they enquired about what happened to just over half of their subseach year - which are paid over to the County and to the National Federation of the W.I. The answer seems to be that nearly all of it is being spent running the Federation itself: organising expensive courses and meetings, mostly too far away for our members to participate in and costing anyone wishing to attend even more. An historic vote was taken and a massive majority decided to become independent and to form our own group.

Consequently, on 8th January 2020, an enthusiastic inaugural meeting of a new women's group was held in the Community Centre. Over thirty attended and there were apologies from four more. A vote was taken on the group's new title and the winning name was 'ST. TEATH JOYBIRDS'. (This had been suggested by Sylvia Mewton - probably the longest serving member of St. Teath W.I. She told us that this was the name of the Concert Party that was formed in St Teath in about 1944. The Concert Party, called the 'Joybirds' was formed by Kitty Parsons and the Rev. Bray. Sylvia joined them at about the age of 17 and took part entertaining people in our village, Tintagel, Camelford, Davidstow, St. Breward and other local communities, with singing, dancing, playing guitars etc. It seemed very appropriate to resurrect the name.)

A simple constitution was agreed and the committee that had overseen last year's W.I. was re-elected en-bloc to organise the formation of the new group. The 'JOYBIRDS' will meet on the second Wednesday of the month in the Community Centre at 7.30pm and enjoy speakers on a wide variety of subjects, quizzes, crafts and entertainment. All this for half the price of the present annual W.I. subscription! Trips are also in the pipeline to cinemas, gardens, wineries, restaurants etc.

On Wednesday 12th February a speaker from St Petrocs (working for the homeless in our society) will give a talk. Our members are bringing toiletries and sanitary products to make a boxful of items for these unfortunate people. Subgroups of like-minded members can be set up - indeed the *KNIT AND NATTER* group is one of them and they are going to be furiously knitting pouches and nests for **abandoned joeys in Australia**, abandoned as their mothers frantically fled those dreadful bush fires. We are now able to support whichever charities the members feel strongly about and to launch our new group we are holding a **Bacon Butty and Hot Dog morning** (vegetarian option available) on Saturday **15th February** at the Community Centre starting at 10.30am. There will be home-made cakes and biscuits to buy and a good raffle too. **All proceeds are for the Australian fire fighters and the Australian animal charities.** Please come and support these causes and enjoy breakfast in the Centre.

#### A Methodist Minister's View

Looking though my diary for the month of February I noted that Sunday, 9<sup>th</sup> February is set aside as Racial Justice Sunday in our Methodist Church year, followed of course by St. Valentines Day on 14<sup>th</sup> February. Valentines Day is amongst the top three Special Occasions for the greetings card industry. However, it may surprise you that it is felt necessary to have a day in which the focus is on Racial Justice.

I find it sad that we need to draw people's attention to the issue of Racial Justice, but it was an issue at the time of the General Election and a running issue over the Christmas/New Year period within some Premier League football matches. You will recall the comments in the run-up to the Election about Islamophobia in the Conservative party and Anti-Semitism in the Labour Party. Within the footballing circles they have been running a 'Respect' programme over the past few seasons in an attempt to address the issue.

All of this is still happening despite the fact that it was more than 55 years ago that Martin Luther King raised the issue in the United States of America, which led to the development of relevant legislation, and education programmes in many countries of the World. I guess that the Queen, the Prime Minister and the Archbishop of Canterbury had the issue in mind, amongst others, when they made references to 'Building up Communities' and overcoming tensions in their Christmas and New Year messages.

Perhaps it is good that Racial Justice Sunday, and St. Valentine's Day, with its emphasis on love, come so closely together. The commandment of Jesus to 'Love one another, just as I love you' (John 15:12) immediately comes to mind when one thinks about these issues. It is also good to remember that we are all given life by God, and we are all equal in his sight.

We live in a Multi-Cultural World, and in Great Britain a Multi-Cultural country. It is good to celebrate this and look at our personal attitudes and prejudices at the same time.






