Methodist Musings – Faith for All!

Many thanks Rev Brian Ede for all that you have brought to these pages over a long period of time. Your words will have been an inspiration to many and have given us all challenges to ponder.

Too many times I hear that people can't come to church because they are not good enough: 'I once did this' or 'I got into trouble when I was a teenager' or 'I am a terrible person'. Jesus once said to some religious leaders, "Whoever is without sin cast the first stone." One by one they left, and the victim of their accusations was able to walk away.



Jesus didn't come to condemn the world and its people – rather, he came to give new life and fresh opportunity for us all to have a relationship with God and with one another. He knows that we mess up at times, and yet he still loves us and wants us to love others unreservedly in just the same way.

How quick we too can be to condemn others' mistakes, just as the religious leaders of Jesus's time did. It's all too easy to see problems elsewhere and yet often we don't know half of the story before we start making judgements. Maybe doing so takes the focus off our own mistakes.

I used to visit a young offenders' centre and many of the young people there had ended up on a downhill slope that saw their freedom taken away. For many it had been small steps of wrong at the beginning and things had then taken a sudden turn for the worse as they got drawn into wrongdoing.

Jesus died on the cross and defeated death for all people, not just those who consider themselves good, but especially for those who have done things wrong, for all who others might condemn and for those who others might ignore. Jesus came to show and share love for the sick, the poor, the marginalised, and to speak out against injustice.

He calls us to show and share love in the same way to all people. No one is ever too bad to have a faith or to come to church. God does of course want us to be better as we grow in love, but just as he has accepted others from where they are for thousands of years, he accepts each one of us today. Know him and share his love!

Annual Parish Meeting

On 24th April, St Teath Parish Council put the kettle on and cracked open the good biscuits to welcome the parish to their annual meeting. This yearly meeting is open to anyone who wants to attend. It provides an opportunity to ask questions of the parish council, share concerns and celebrate successes.

County Councillor Dominic Fairman opened the meeting by sharing his admiration for everything that St Teath achieves as a parish and said he felt there was exemplary activity from the Parish Council in helping to make St Teath a model village in the way it works as a community, for the community and in the community. Several parishioners also thanked the Parish Council for all their hard work and commitment to the village over the past year.

Following a parishioner's question, Cllr Kerri Kitto explained the progress of the VAS traffic calming cameras in the village. We all hope that these contribute to making the village a safer place. This was followed by presentations by seven local community groups and organisations, which shared their achievements and their plans for the year ahead. Several groups requested the need for more volunteers and there were lots of sharing ideas and support between groups.

Cllr Kerri then gave an overview of the Community Sparks Fund: £6,970 has been granted in this year's fund. It will continue to run annually, and this year's deadline for submissions is 30 September 2024. The meeting ended with Cllr Kerri thanking everyone for attending and for their continued hard work and dedication to improving our lives in the parish.

Flowers and Footballs in the Field

Last autumn, the Parish Council submitted a bid to the Community Infrastructure levy fund with the intention of purchasing some land for the parish to be used by St Teath AFC children's football and to include a wildflower walk that will circle the main pitch. We are very pleased to say that that funding bid was successful and we have just completed on the sale of this land.

We are currently working alongside the football club to complete the fencing, and with the Community Gardeners to provide some planting in the walking area. We look forward to seeing the new space in use by the community in the coming months.



A Lay Minister Writes...

Dear Friends,

Do you do an everyday task in a particular way because doing it like that reminds you of something, or someone, special and/or perhaps it makes you smile? No? Just me? Surely not!

Anyhow, let me share how I boil an egg: room temperature, free-range local eggs gently placed into water that's just approaching a rolling boil for exactly three minutes and seventeen seconds; remove eggs from water; place in eggcup and bash 'em. Perfectly dippy every time.



The key? 3 minutes 17 seconds. Not really for a culinary reason, more because it reminds me of my favourite Bible passage, which, if you haven't yet come across it, let me introduce you... It's tucked away towards the end of the Old Testament, written by a chap few have heard of, Zephaniah. He only penned three chapters. This is verse 17 of the final one, and there's a lot in it:

'For the Lord your God is living among you. He is a mighty saviour. He will take delight in you with gladness. He will calm you with his love. He will rejoice over you with joyful songs.'

Can you imagine? This is the God who created everything and everyone here now – living with us. Not just here, but delighting in us with gladness. What does that look like, I wonder? Well, we are told that he made each one of us and that he was very pleased. Sure, there are things we say and do which cause him pain, but God is a loving God, to whom we can return when we stop those actions. We can say and mean 'sorry', and he welcomes us back with open arms.

He calms us with his love. There is nothing that ever surprises God, nor takes him aback; nothing that he can't cope with; nothing he's not seen before. Through his son Jesus's time on Earth, he gets how being human feels. Whatever is going on for us, we can turn to him; he's right here and he understands it (that's not to say he will take it away, for earthly life is what it is) but he will walk in it, with us.

Then we come to the most amazing bit: 'He will rejoice over you with joyful songs.' What does that sound like, I wonder? The song of a wren or a great massed choir and orchestra? A baby's cry or the crashing of waves? Perhaps joyful songs are more visual – the Northern Lights (visible from even Delabole in May) or a butterfly's wing? Whatever it is, God says, 'He will rejoice over you with joyful songs.'

Now, what happens when we say it out loud, changing the word 'you' to 'me'? 'The Lord will calm ME with his love. He will rejoice over ME with joyful songs.' WOW! How brilliant is that? We have only scratched the surface of my favourite verse, Zephaniah 3:17. Yet, here we have it – a culinary top tip and I pray: words of hope, reassurance and total joy.

County Council

Every year, as summer approaches, there is inevitably talk at Cornwall Council about the pros and cons of a Tourist Tax. Cornwall receives around 4 million holiday visits each year, as well as around 12 million day-trippers. While this provides nearly £1 billion to the Cornish economy, it does not come without significant cost and pressure on our roads, waste, policing and water, and the benefits and drawbacks are in no way evenly distributed within the county.



It would no doubt be a contentious move to introduce such a scheme, but many tourism hotspots around the world have already implemented tourist taxes and many others are now experiencing protests from local people against "overtourism". This is a phrase that could equally be applied to many parts of Cornwall: describing an industry that provides mostly low-wage seasonal jobs, while putting immense pressure on the availability of local housing for local people.

In the UK, many areas are already starting down the tourist-tax road, with Liverpool and Manchester placing an additional levy on their business rates for accommodation and then encouraging providers to pass this on as an additional item – or tax – on their invoices. This also happens in Blackpool, Great Yarmouth and the Tweed Valley, and Cambridge is proposing a similar scheme.

A fully fledged tourist tax would require primary legislation, and the devolved governments in Scotland and Wales, who already have powers to do so, have both promised to bring this forward. In addition, the long-promised introduction of compulsory registration of short-term holiday lets (such as Airbnb) should help to make any scheme work fairly, and there are many other councils across the country actively lobbying now for all of this to be brought forward.

A recent committee report at New County Hall on tourism included a recommendation for the Council to be heavily involved in a new Local Visitor Economy Partnership – a Tourist Board to you and me – but did not address the idea of a tax on visitors in any way, shape or form. I suspect that this is due to pressure from the current Conservative administration, which does not favour such a move.

As we will now have both local and general elections within the next 12 months, it will be interesting to see which parties are bold enough to make this a manifesto promise. Personally, I feel that this is an idea whose time has come. It has proved to be workable and sustainable in other locations, and I do not believe that Cornwall would be unduly disadvantaged or suffer economically if fairly implemented - it might even be seen as a positive measure by promoting responsible tourism. Each £1 of levy raised per night could provide around £24M for local public services – many of which, of course, also benefit the many visitors attracted to our beautiful corner of the country.




