# Methodist Musings - Happy Easter!

Someone once asked me, "What is your favourite season?" It was very difficult to answer, because there's something in every season that I like: sunshine in summer, festivals in autumn, Christmas in winter, and colourful flowers in spring.

Spring is also the season of many saints days: St Piran, St David and St Patrick, when people celebrate in their own unique ways. But perhaps the greatest springtime celebration is that of Easter, which for Christians is both the high and low point of their year. It starts in



earnest with Holy Week on Palm Sunday (13th April), when we recall Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and ends on Easter Sunday with the joy of Jesus' resurrection.

In between there are the sombre days of the Last Supper with his friends, where he gave symbols of bread and wine, still used today as a remembrance when we celebrate Holy Communion, and Good Friday, when Jesus paid the ultimate sacrifice by dying a cruel and inhumane death on a cross, alongside the criminals in society, instigated by the jealousy of powerful faith leaders who wanted him out of the way.

What a roller-coaster ride it must have been for his friends and family, with some days feeling like there was very little hope for life going forward. I've spoken to many people recently who feel somewhat similar as we switch on or read the daily news reports of ongoing wars, suffering and uncertainty. It can sometimes feel that everything is spiralling out of control and we wonder where it will all end.

Hindsight is a wonderful thing, and in the case of Easter it shows us that even in the darkest times there is hope. For Christians, that hope is found in Jesus, who is the only person throughout history who is documented to have been resurrected from death, which today is still relevant as it offers us forgiveness and freedom from the sinfulness of life and abundant and eternal life starting here and now.

Humanly speaking, this Easter hope is impossible for us to understand, but spiritually, it offers us hope, for life. Perhaps we've previously dismissed Jesus as fable or myth, or perhaps we're saving him for a rainy day. Well, maybe this year is a time to think about the hope that God offers us through the events of Easter, the hope that we see springing up in the daffodils and tulips as our gardens fill with colour once more, and we remember that life is for living, to its fullest.

However you celebrate Easter, may you experience, love, joy and hope in all its fullness.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him." (Romans 15:13)



Well done all!













### A Letter From Your MP

Hello again St. Teath! It's time for another update on what has been an absolutely packed few weeks. One of the biggest local issues I raised in Parliament was the sewage disaster at the Chapelfields development over in St Mabyn. Residents have been left dealing with an utterly unacceptable sewage situation, and I made it clear that water companies must be held accountable for these failings. Infrastructure should always be in place before any new development begins, not as an afterthought. I have also contacted South West Water directly, demanding further urgent action to resolve the issue.



The state of Bodmin's GP services has also remained a top priority for me these last few weeks. Bosvena Health continues to run at 150% capacity, while thousands more homes are due to be built in the town. This is completely unsustainable, and I have now escalated the issue directly with the Health Minister, calling for urgent action to secure a second GP building. The delays in securing this vital new facility have already gone on far too long (having been promised a long time ago), and I will not let the issue drop until Bodmin gets this investment in health services.

I also stood up for Cornwall's farmers in Parliament, after DEFRA suddenly shut down new applications to the Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI) with no notice whatsoever. Farmers were told they'd have six weeks' warning before any changes were made, yet were instead blindsided overnight. With SFI cuts, the family farm tax, and facing rocketing costs, the Government is making life harder for farmers. I challenged the Minister directly in the House of Commons, asking why any young person would want to enter farming in the current climate. Shockingly, his response was to laugh it off – a real slap in the face to farmers here in North Cornwall.

Meanwhile, out on the doorsteps of North Cornwall, I've been meeting with residents in Bodmin, St Eval and many other areas, listening to concerns and gathering feedback on local issues. I also held another constituency surgery, giving people the opportunity to raise issues with me directly. A polite reminder that if you need my help with casework or issues affecting you, please get in touch via ben.maguire.mp@parliament, and I'll be happy to help in any way I can.

I also visited both Callywith College and Launceston College and spoke with so many bright students. It's always great to hear from young people who are engaged and passionate about the world, and I'd like to thank the staff and pupils of both colleges for having me along.


In other news, Cornwall's future was a major topic on the Politics South West programme, where I stood up and made the case for a Cornwall-only devolution deal. The people of Cornwall over-whelmingly reject any move to merge us into a 'Devonwall' combined authority, and I made clear that our unique cultural and historical identity must be respected. Devolution should empower Cornwall, NOT lump us into a broader, Plymouth-led authority that does not reflect our needs.

Lastly, I've been keeping up pressure on Cornwall Council over the Newquay Airport debacle. After wasting £1 million of public money on a botched sale, the same Conservative cabinet member responsible has now landed a £70,000-a-year job at the airport! This raises serious concerns about transparency and accountability, and I will continue pushing for answers.

### Revd. Nicki Writes...

#### **Dear Friends**

As we move into April, Easter is fast approaching. What does Easter mean to you? For some, it is the enjoyment of the bank holidays and having some family time. For children and teachers, it is a break from school and hopefully some rest and relaxation. For others, it marks the end of the Lent fast and looking forward to those luxuries that may have been given up over the past 40 days. Easter is the end of a season of reflection



and self-searching, with a step into a new season and the fullness of life the Easter story brings.

Easter marks the new beginning of Christ rising from the tomb, having overcome sin and death and rising to new life. It is a story that was significant to the disciples and the early followers of Jesus, but one that is also significant to us today, when we recognise how our story fits into the story of God and his love for people shown through the life and death of Jesus Christ.

The disciples had journeyed with Jesus for 3 years, listening to his teaching, witnessing him dealing compassionately with people, healing the sick and observing outward demonstrations of love, not just to a few but to all who wanted to hear and receive, including those on the margins of society.

The disciples were often confused and bewildered as Jesus prepared them for his final days where they would be part of the triumphant ride into Jerusalem, waving palms and shouting Hallelujah, to the sharing of the final meal together, where Jesus performed an outrageous act of love and service as he washed their feet. This led on to the anguishing pain of the horrific crucifixion, the lowest point where they thought their friend was gone, to the glorious moment of the resurrection where they gradually started to understand all he had been telling them. They realised that a story that had been full of despair and hopelessness was quite the opposite. It was an act of love that brought about a new season of life, one that was full of hope and transformation.

We each have our own life story and we can often feel confused and bewildered at the complexities of life. But are we willing, like the disciples, to trust Jesus, even if we don't fully understand, in order that we too can find that hope and love in our own lives?

Holy Week takes us on a journey of emotions, from celebration to sadness and back into the glorious light of Easter and the resurrection. You are warmly invited to services across our group of churches that enter into this story; details can be found in the churches or on the website at camelallenchurches.org.uk. I pray that the glorious light of Easter will allow the love of Christ, as he opened wide his arms on the cross, to embrace you afresh this year as you are reminded of this truth.

'For God so loved the world / that he gave his one and only Son / that whoever believes in him / shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

### Flower Festival 2025


It's a Flower Festival year, and it will be on Friday 25th, Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th July in St Teath Church.

# **County Council**

The government has created some confusion around some local elections this year as they press ahead with their devolution ambitions. However, Cornwall Council and Town and Parish elections are still happening on Thursday May 1st.

Recent political choices have shown how important our local elections are - with our car parks being privatised and outsourced to out-of-county operators, and the closure of local Adult Education Centres and bus routes. For these reasons and



many others, I urge you to use your vote to ensure that you get a Council that reflects your expectations and values.

There are certain key dates that you need to be aware of.

- Deadline to register to vote (if you're not already registered): Friday 11 April 2025
- Deadline to apply to vote by post or to change or cancel an existing postal vote or proxy vote: Monday 14 April
- Deadline to apply for Voter Authority Certificate or to apply to vote by proxy: Weds 23 April

If you've changed address or moved home since registering to vote at the general election last year, it takes just five minutes to update your details at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote, and don't forget that you will also need to show photo ID at polling stations this May. Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of photo ID can apply for free ID online.

For personal reasons I will not be standing for re-election on May 1st. I have represented you now for nearly nine years and it has been both an honour and privilege to do so. Being chosen to represent over 5,000 voters over six parishes has been a humbling yet enjoyable responsibility that I have always taken very seriously.

I have met and engaged with hundreds of wonderful people and have never been threatened or abused – even when tackling quite difficult issues. I have also regularly attended our Parish Council meetings and continue to be impressed with the strength and resilience of these bands of volunteers working hard on behalf of their communities.

I know that my party – the Liberal Democrats – has already selected a very capable and caring local candidate for the election and I am sure that other political parties will be bringing forward their nominations as we get closer to the day. Please use your vote on May 1st and thank you for allowing me the pleasure and opportunity to represent our area at New County Hall these past years – it is a period of my life that I will always look back upon with immense pride.
