

St Teath Remembers VE Day 80



On the 8th May, St Teath celebrated the anniversary of VE Day. At just before 10 am, Major N K Solomon (Retd.) read the official proclamation (see page 6), followed in the Community Centre by a friendly gathering that raised £250 for The Royal British Legion. In our village school, the children sang 'We'll Meet Again' and observed the two-minute silence, followed by a red, white and blue picnic in the sunshine.

In the evening, the church choir sang hymns and the National Anthem; the names of the village fallen were read; and Cllr Gorrigan laid a beautiful Bruallen wreath. The Last Post was played and a two-minute silence was observed. Finally, our church bells rang out at 6.30, joining bells across Cornwall and the whole country.

A Letter From Your MP

Well, St Teath, it's safe to say we had some excellent results in the Cornwall Council elections in May! After so much campaigning, so many conversations on the doorsteps and tireless efforts from our team and volunteers, I'm incredibly proud to say that the Liberal Democrats now have 11 Cornwall Councillors here in North Cornwall, and 26 across the Duchy as a whole. This is a huge step forward for our communities, and it means we'll now have an even stronger, united team of Cornwall Councillors ready to get to work and deliver real change where it's needed most.



Your new Cornwall Councillor here in St Teath is David Garrigan, a fellow Liberal Democrat who lives locally in Delabole. David has taken up the position from Dominic Fairman, his very well-known and respected predecessor, and is already working hard for the people of St Teath. On polling day, he gained 1,130 votes – a whopping 53% of the vote share! For those looking to reach out to David for any council-related casework, email: cllr.david.garrigan@cornwall.gov.uk

Sadly, the success of the local elections was marred by a disturbing incident in Launceston, where political graffiti was sprayed across shops, homes and even our North Cornwall Liberal Democrats office. This sort of vandalism has no place in our democracy. Whatever your political views, dialogue must always be the way forward. NOT intimidation or destruction. We've now spoken to the police about this matter, and hope those responsible are brought to justice.

A major issue I raised in Parliament recently was access to Legal Aid in rural areas like ours. With Citizens Advice branches having closed across Cornwall, too many people are left without meaningful support when facing rogue landlords, unfair property management firms or legal disputes they simply can't afford to fight. I spoke about a group of residents in Camelford who are unable to challenge exploitative fees from a developer, and another case outside Wadebridge where a tenant is battling an unscrupulous landlord. Without legal aid, there's no route to justice, and it's not acceptable. I've urged the Solicitor General to ensure legal support is accessible to everyone here in Cornwall, no matter their postcode or income.

I've also continued pushing for action on banking access in towns like Wadebridge, which has now lost all of its physical bank branches. These closures are devastating for residents who rely on in-person services – particularly older people, disabled residents and small businesses. I'm calling for a full Banking Hub to be set up in the town, just like we now have in Bodmin.

Lastly, I was delighted to secure a meeting with the Minister from the Department for Environment, Food, and Rural Affairs, to take forward our plans to extend the Camel Trail up to Camelford. It's used by over half a million people a year, and I've been working to have the trail extended to the town. Having pledged nine new River Walks in their election manifesto last year, the Government seems keen to take my proposals seriously. I'm looking forward to working with our newly elected Cornwall Councillors Mark Burnett, Rosie Moore and David Garrigan on this.

As ever, the work continues – and with our new team of Lib Dem Cornwall Councillors, we're now better positioned than ever to deliver for North Cornwall. I look forward to seeing more of you out and about in the coming weeks, but until then, enjoy the sun, and take care.

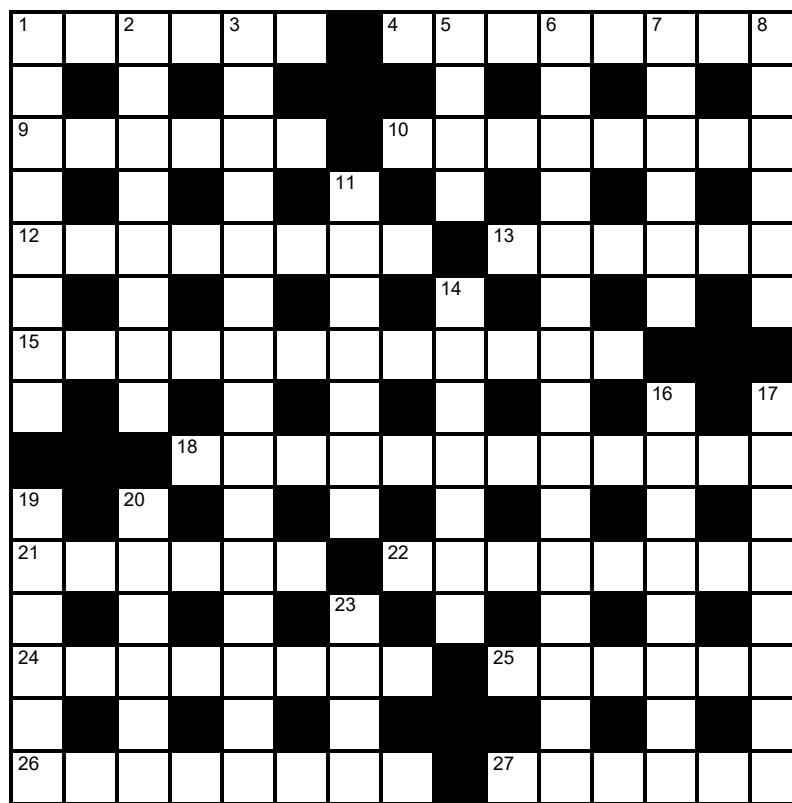

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A Lay Reader Writes...

Dear Friends,
Going up?

The Church has just marked a major festival – Ascension Day, rather later in the year than normal, because Easter was about as late as it can be. Forty days on, we mark Jesus's return to heaven. He's walked the Earth and met with some 500 people since rising from the dead and destroying the darkness of death forever; now he must go back.



In a fairly normal start to the day, Jesus and some friends climb the Mount of Olives – a favourite place. Jesus tells his followers to continue His work, train people in the Christian way of life and make new disciples. He promises to remain with them for all time. With that, He rises into heaven; shrouded in cloud, He disappears from sight.

Soon, two men in white robes ask why they're looking up into an empty sky and tell them to instead look around and do as Jesus said. Following Jesus's instructions, they return to Jerusalem and await the Holy Spirit, the Helper, the Strength to do Jesus's work. Ten days later, at Pentecost, with wind and fire, the Holy Spirit comes, enabling Jesus's disciples and friends to share His Good News, with miraculous results.

We might wonder, why did Jesus have to leave? Surely the world would have been better had He remained, teaching, healing, doing the miracles. The world could have been so different. Well, yes and no... Yes, Jesus changed the lives of many. And no – when on Earth, He could only be where His sandaled feet touched the ground; now He can work through anyone, anywhere, anytime.

'Well,' you may be thinking, 'we don't have to be Christian or go to church to help others.' And you are right – people of all faiths and none help and support neighbours, friends and strangers. A vital and valued service that everyone, by the sheer fact of our human nature, is called to do.

Yet those who are followers of Christ have, perhaps, even more responsibility. Like those first Christians, we have received the strength of the Holy Spirit, and as Teresa of Avila (1515–1582) wrote:

Christ has no body but yours,
Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good,
Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world.
Yours are the hands, yours are the feet,
Yours are the eyes, you are his body.
Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

Or, if there were some 21st-century people dressed in white, they might ask us why we are looking at the floor or gazing at our navels. They might tell us to look around instead and do as Jesus says – crack on, serve, support, help, share the Good News of Jesus and not just leave it to someone else. So, what are we waiting for?

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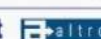
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St Teath Community Bus
