Art Group News

On Wednesday 8th July, the members of the Art Group enjoyed a workshop led by Kim Hill, one of our members.

Kim showed us a painting of hers – dark, mystical and entrancing (pictured left, below). She then explained how we would all produce something of our own using similar techniques. She began by completely covering a canvas board in orange acrylic paint, before blending in two white stripes and sponging yellow all over. We then attempted to do the same.

Kim's second step was to add in 'suggestions' of trees, a horizon and two waterfalls using either a dark purple or grey or black. She went on to use a fan brush to add green leaves, and white and water (for the waterfalls and pools).

We tried to replicate what she had demonstrated, although she was keen for us to 'do our own thing'. We all produced something interesting – see below right picture for the halfway point of one piece – and it was quite a surprise to see the range of colours and styles of our finished pieces.

We are very grateful to Kim for stepping out of her comfort zone – to stand up and lead a group activity isn't easy – and many of us learnt new tricks, especially with the sponge.

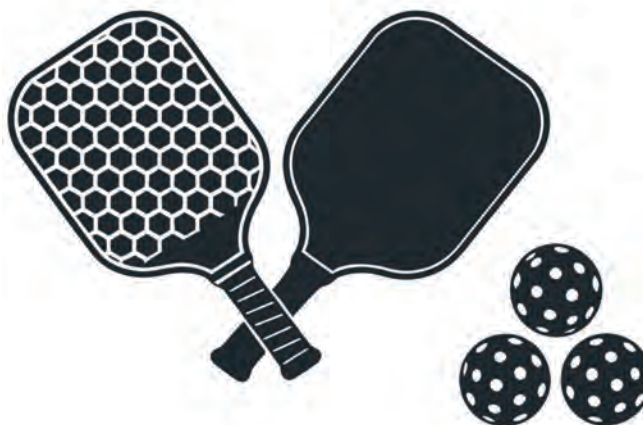

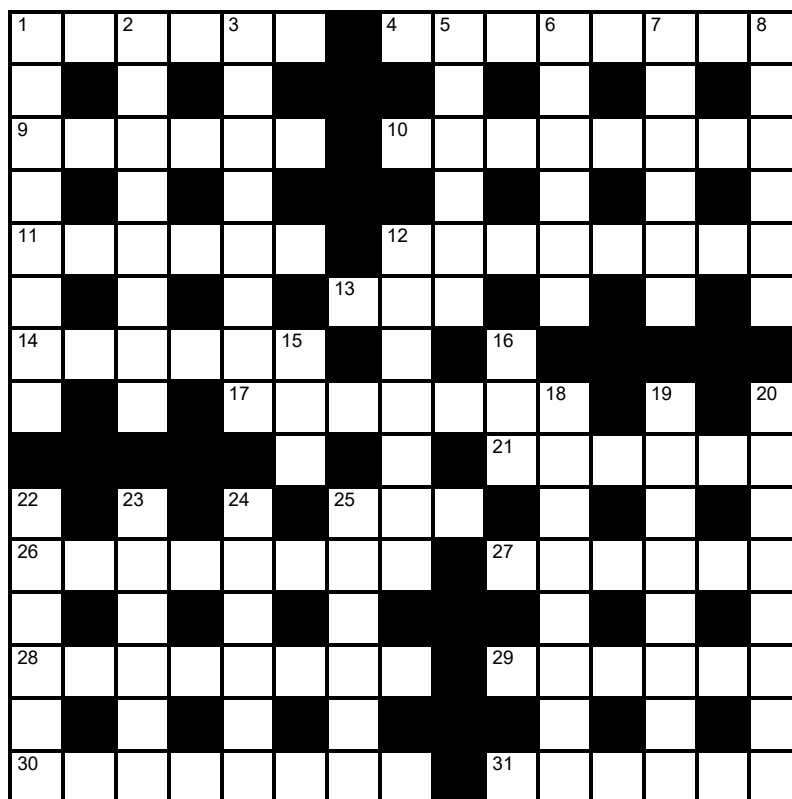

A Letter From Your MP

Recently I celebrated two years since I was elected as your MP, and it has been an incredible privilege to serve my constituents. Looking back over the past two years, we've achieved so much: securing new investment for Cornwall; standing up for our farmers, fishermen and small businesses; challenging South West Water over sewage dumping; campaigning for better NHS dentistry; protecting our Minor Injuries Units; fighting for better transport and affordable housing; helping thousands of constituents through almost 20,000 casework items – the list goes on. There is much more to do, but I remain determined to put North Cornwall's needs at the forefront of debates in Parliament, and keep fighting for the issues that matter most to local people. Thank you for all your kind support!



One issue I raised in Parliament on behalf of constituents recently was the need for much tougher action against animal cruelty. I called on the Government to introduce a complete ownership ban for people convicted of the most serious acts of animal abuse, because I believe anyone who tortures or harms an animal should never be trusted with ownership again. I also argued that stronger sentencing powers are needed to ensure punishments reflect the severity of the crimes.

I've also continued my campaign to protect North Cornwall's volunteer coastguards, which is an issue many of you have got in touch about and urged me to keep pushing on. I challenged Ministers over the Maritime and Coastguard Agency's plans to overhaul the way volunteers are compensated. The current payment is modest (£11 an hour) but it helps volunteers who already make considerable personal and financial sacrifices to remain available for emergency call-outs. I pressed the Government on whether Ministers had actually consulted coastguards before making these proposals, whether a full impact assessment will now be carried out, and whether alternative approaches could be adopted that protect recruitment and retention. Volunteers perform an essential service for North Cornwall, and need the support and respect they deserve.

I visited Camelford alongside Cornwall Councillor Mark Burnett to discuss the proposed extension of the Camel Trail. This exciting project has the potential to bring many more visitors into the town, increase footfall for local shops and cafés and provide a significant boost to Camelford's high street. We discussed the next stages of the bidding process and how we can continue building the strongest possible case to secure funding for this important investment.

I also tabled a Parliamentary motion recently that called on FIFA to protect the integrity of football following reports of political interference in disciplinary decisions involving the US national team. Sport should be free from political influence, and decisions must remain independent, transparent and fair. I also highlighted the growing problem of excessive ticket prices, because football should remain accessible to ordinary supporters, not something only a privileged few can afford.

To bring things to a close, the past two years have really reminded me just how much can be achieved by working closely with residents, community groups, local Councillors (like Cllr David Garrigan here in St Teath!), small businesses, and other organisations across our constituency. Every campaign, every casework success, and every improvement here begins with people speaking up - which is why anyone with questions, queries, or campaigns for me is welcome to get in touch to make sure your voice is heard loud and clear in Westminster.

A Lay Reader Writes...

Dear Friends,

As I write, there is excitement in the air. With a week before local schools break-up, final preparations are being made for Delabole then St Teath carnivals; various secret activities are taking place in gardens and garages, requiring several trips to the yard for wood, paint and a range of other bits and pieces. On the roads, cars have grown top boxes while caravans and some mighty mobile homes are being all too carefully navigated through our lanes.



By the time this is published, holidays will be in full swing. Hopefully the current spell of fantastic weather will hold, and the county will be filled with visitors, spending their money in local businesses and having a great, memorable time. Who doesn't love a holiday? Time away from the ordinary run of things. We don't have to even cross the Tamar; living where we do, a staycation can be ideal. It simply does us all good to stop doing the things we normally do: spend time with the family, perhaps read the book that's been on the shelf for years, go on a particular walk, visit a special place, pause, take care of ourselves, reset.

It's only when we stop that we may realise how busy we have become. It's very easy to take on just one more job, do just one more task; it's all too easy to find ourselves functioning less well as a result. It can be as if there are two slices of toast and one spoon of jam – do we enjoy one piece of toast and jam, or try to spread it so thinly over both pieces when neither taste as they should? Various studies show that the way of the world, in which people are becoming ever more busy and not taking time out, is having a detrimental impact on the health of swathes of the population.

God knows about taking rest; the Bible is filled with calls to take time out; God leads by example. After He had created the world in six days [whether you read that literally as 6 x 24 hours or six periods of time, for the Bible also tells us 1,000 years is like a day to God; either way] on the seventh day, God rested. The three Abrahamic faiths each have a weekly Holy Day / holiday – Judaism, on the Sabbath [25 hours after sundown on Friday]; Christianity, Sunday; Islam, Jum'ah, Friday, specifically set aside for prayer. Buddhists take four days a month, based on the lunar cycle. Almost all other world religions and cultures hold to some days of rest.

The Psalmist writes, 'The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake.' (Psalm 23:1-3) Jesus says, 'The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath.' (Mark 2:27) He also says, 'Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.' (Matthew 11:28-29) The prophet Isaiah writes, 'But they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.' (Isaiah 40:31)

Whether this summer time allows you to take a break or your circumstances mean that it's another time of the year, please do each and all look after yourselves; have regular rest, renew and reset and enjoy a great and memorable time.

Like many of you, I have been following England's progress in the men's football World Cup. They fell just short of reaching the final, but what a journey it was. As football fans, we believe that maybe this time will be our time. Hope springs eternal.

Watching England brought back memories of World Cups from years gone by. Certain tournaments become more than football competitions. They become markers in your own life. Argentina in 1978 was probably the first World Cup that settled in my memory.

I was nine years old. Not every match or result, but the feeling of it. Summer evenings, TV pictures that somehow looked different and the growing realisation there was a whole world beyond the local pitch. By Spain in 1982 I was hooked. England started brightly, Brazil played some of the most beautiful football ever seen and yet it was Italy who lifted the trophy. Perhaps that was an early lesson that life, like football, does not always reward those who seem to deserve it most.



Next came Mexico '86 and Maradona, who produced both the Hand of God and the Goal of the Century in the same tournament. Football and life in one player: flawed, controversial, brilliant and unforgettable. And then Italia '90. Lineker's goals, Gazza's tears and another painful penalty shoot-out. For many, it remains one of those moments where you can remember where you were when it happened. When I think about those tournaments, I remember far more than football. I remember family living rooms, friends, school holidays, summer weather, hopes and disappointments. The football is woven into the memories of growing up. Perhaps that is why England's recent defeat should not overshadow what they achieved. We often remember the winners, but we treasure the journey. Winning the trophy is the dream. Enjoying the ride is the privilege.

There may even be a lesson there we can take from the Argentina game, sitting back and defending a lead rarely ends well. Sometimes you have to keep pushing forward. The same is true for Cornwall. We cannot simply defend what we have. We have to be ambitious for our villages, our young people and our future. That feels especially relevant as we adjust to a new Prime Minister. Andy Burnham arrives in Downing Street after years as Mayor of Greater Manchester and as someone who has often spoken about rebalancing power away from London. His decision to establish a Number 10 office in the North is a clear signal of where his priorities lie.

The question for places like Cornwall is simple, where does that leave us? While cities will always have an important part to play in the national economy, rural communities have their own challenges and opportunities. Our needs are different. We need investment in housing that local people can afford, better transport links, stronger mobile and broadband coverage and infrastructure that works for sparsely populated areas. With colleagues at Cornwall Council and Ben Maguire MP, I will be making sure Cornwall's voice is heard loudly and clearly. If government is serious about spreading opportunity across the country, that must include rural and coastal communities, not just major cities.

For now though, there is much to celebrate. Carnival season, summer unfolding and our communities showing the resilience, kindness and spirit that make them special places to live. Sometimes, as football reminds us, the trophy matters. But often it is the journey that stays with us longest.

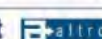
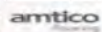
